Mac reported on the talk by DeVashree Saha of the Brookings Institution. "In 2014, the International Energy Agency reported that energy-related CO2 emissions stayed flat, despite an increase of around 3% in global GDP, so actually for the first time in 40 years, there was a reduction in carbon emissions that was not tied to an economic crisis. The trend continued in 2015. In recent years, economic growth has been decoupled with fossil fuel growth, and this will continue."
