- Grasstops: We are developing relationships and seeking endorsements of the EICDA or other actions/statements that further the CCL agenda. These are the active teams (team leader in parentheses): Schweitzer (Tim Trese), Northwest River Supply (Mac Cantrell), Alta Engineering (Margrit von Braun), McGregor (Trish Harzell), Alturas Analytics (Martha Lovett)
- We are returning to businesses who signed the 2017 letter for EICDA endorsement. If you got one of these earlier signatures, can you make the return visit?
- The Ag. team has secured an agreement from the Pullman and Moscow Chambers of Commerce to co-sponsor, with CCL-P, a workshop or forum for the broader agricultural community and the public this November, tentatively titled Palouse Agriculture in an Era of Change.
- The radio spots team (Diana Armstrong) is working on the local production of radio spots
- The Climate Action Working Group (CAWG) of the Moscow Sustainable Environment Commission plans to host a public forum on Earth Day—April 22—in the City Council Chamber, to share its work and solicit input from the public. The goal is the City's commitment to achieve 100% clean, renewable energy from all sectors by 2045.
