Practice explaining why Congress needs to work on permitting reform

Talking points - make permitting reform a priority

- 1. 80% of the carbon pollution reductions in the Inflation Reduction Act rely on being able to build and connect clean energy projects. We need permitting reform to speed up the process.
- 2. Congress did part of what was needed earlier this year, making it easier to build clean energy projects. But there's more work to be done, especially when it comes to ensuring new transmission lines can be built in a timely and effective manner.
- 3. Bipartisan conversations and collaborations on permitting reform are happening let's encourage our members of Congress to get this essential policy over the finish line!
