COMMUNICATION SKILLS EXERCISE

Practice asking a friend about their plan to vote: Voting conversation

You: Hiya Sam. What's up? How are you feeling about the election?

Your friend: Hi Alice. I'm well, but I'm super busy and I haven't been watching TV. What's happening?

You: I've been busy too, but I'm excited to vote for climate forward candidates. Are you registered?

Your friend: I'm not sure. How would I find out?

You: You can check to see if you're registered at vote.org. And if you're not registered, you can get signed up there.

Your friend: Okay, vote.org, got it. But I've moved since the last election and I may want to vote by mail.

You: No problem. You can update your mailing address at vote.org too. And if you change your mind about mailing your ballot, you can also find your polling place at vote.org.

Your friend: Awesome. I enjoy the excitement of voting in person when I have the time.

You: Be sure to decide before the vote-by-mail deadline (you can look that up on vote.org as well). If you vote in person, I might see you there. I'm volunteering to be a 2024 poll worker for the first time!
